

X-WAIVER TRAININGS

This eight-hour course prepares Physicians, PA, NP, CNM, CNS, and CRNA's to prescribe buprenorphine to treat opioid use disorder. The course fulfills 8 hours of the training needed to obtain a waiver to prescribe buprenorphine to over 30 patients for Physicians. Advanced Practice Providers must complete an additional 16 hours of specialized training following this training in order to prescribe buprenorphine to over 30 patients.
